


YEAR 2- Summer 2

OUR TOPIC FOR THIS HALF TERM: Great Explorers

In our topic lessons this half term, we will be continuing to learn all about Ibn Battutta, Neil Armstrong, Amelia Earhart and Christopher Columbus and how



their actions have affected our lives today as well as looking at how exploration has changed over time. In RE, we are looking at how we can show we care towards others. In Values, we are learning all about money, how to save it for something in the future and the difference between something we want and something we need. In our Music lessons, we are learning all about different genres of music and appraising their similarities and differences. PE skills, this half term, are focused on getting us Sports Day ready and how to play within a team in a competitive game. We are getting crafty in D&T, learning how to build a box car using wheels and axels. KEY LEARNING IN MATHS:

In Maths we will be learning about Position / Direction using our Fraction knowledge to support, Time and Statistics. In this topic we will be looking at a series of ways to represent information e.g. block graph, pictogram, bar chart.

This will link back to our computing work in the Spring Term on data and information.

How you can help at home:

Getting practical will really support your child with learning the language around position and direction, e.g. take a walk around your local area - can your child direct you by using language such as forwards, backwards, left, right, turn clockwise, anticlockwise, half a turn, quarter turn, full turn. Children often find it difficult to know and recognise their left and right. To help identify these you could ask your child to paint with their left hand etc. Telling the time is incredibly tricky. Sitting with your child for 5 minutes a day to look at a clock and practise using time language can really help them to remember the order.
